#### MINUTES OF GENERAL MEETING

### NOVEMBER 1, 1978

A general meeting of the Skagit County Flood Control Council was held at 7:30 P.M. in Hearing Room "C", Skagit County Administration Building. About 30 persons were in attendance.

President Pete Walker called the meeting to order.

President Walker introduced members from the Army Corps of Engineers attending the meeting. Mr. Forest Brooks, Study Manager for the Levee Project, and Vern Cook, Project Manager for the Levee Project. Also, the officers and Director of the Skagit County Flood Control Council.

President Walker introduced Mr. Gene Sampley, Skagit County Engineer. Mr. Sampley stated that the Levee Project is a high priority project for Skagit County. The Skagit County Engineers have established a Flood and Drainage Department with Mr. Donald Nelson as Section Manager. One of the prime functions of this Department is to coordinate the Levee Project between Skagit County, the Corps of Engineers, the Dike Districts and the people of Skagit County.

Mr. Sampley stated we are looking for a maximum in communications and he and Mr. Nelson are making trips each month or — as needed to the Seattle office of the Corps to assure close communications between the two agencies. Mr. Sampley went on to say the responsibility of Skagit County is to acquire all the additional right-of-way needed for this project and the Engineering Department is presently engaged in this work. Should you have any questions concerning the Levee Project, please contact Mr. Donald Nelson of the Skagit County Engineer's Department.

President Walker introduced Mr. George Dynes. Mr. Dynes reported on the October meeting of the Pacific Northwest Waterways Assn. Mr. Dynes assured the Council that the association is behind this project and will do everything possible to help see the project through to its completion. Mr. Dynes also reported on todays luncheon with Senator Jackson. Senator Jackson has assured us quick passage of the Omnibus Bill and support of the Levee Project.

Mr. Donald Nelson, Council Secretary and Flood Control Section Manager for the Skagit County Engineers Department reported on Skagit County's tentative schedule for right-of-way acquisition for the Levee Project.

- 1. Complete maps of existing dike right-of-way and property by February, 1979.
- 2. Receive draft design memorandum from Corps in December, 1978. Establish additional right-of-way needed for project and write deeds completed by April, 1979.

3. Appraise and negotiate purchase of needed right-of-way to be completed by April, 1980.

Mr. Vern Cook and Mr. Forest Brooks presented the Council with an update on the design of the Levee Project. Mr. Brooks reviewed the six alternatives presented at the Corps public meeting in March of this year. At the March meeting a substantial amount of those present indicated a preference for Alternate No. 3.

Alternate No. 3 provided high level flood protection for the urban areas (100 year frequency) and lower protection for the rural area (about 10 to 15 year frequency) from the mouth of both Forks of the Skagit River upstream to Sedro Woolley.

Five variations of Alternate No. 3 were presented. Plan 3 (e) appears to be the best plan. Plan 3 (e) would give the cities of Mount Vernon and Burlington, the Riverbend area on the Mount Vernon side, as well as the Avon side, 100 year protection. The rest of the lower basin, 50 year protection. This plan would include raising the levees below Mount Vernon with earth dikes to the 50 year frequency. Construction of concrete sea walls through Mount Vernon and the west side of Mount Vernon. Levees through the Riverbend up to Burlington to 100 year protection with a weir from Burlington to Sedro Woolley to protect the Samish River Basin from increased flow from the Skagit River.

Sketches of recreation, landscape, and beautification were presented. These consisted of beautification for the sea wall through Mount Vernon, a possible tilt-up wall for the Lions Park area. This wall would act as a sidewalk until those times of high water. At that time the sidewalk would tilt up and become a sea wall. Bicycle trails were addressed for urban areas of Mount Vernon and Burlington. Landscaping for existing river access areas were also presented.

Mr. Cook and Mr. Brooks fielded several questions from the council floor. They were asked if any work was proposed for the Nookachamps area. No work is proposed for this area by this project.

The question was raised that, with the added protection and the increased cost, is the project becoming so expensive that we could lose it. This was a difficult question to answer as there is no sure answer. However, the local sponsor has the option to direct the limits of the project. One hundred year protection for urban areas is the minimum protection supported by the Federal Government.

The meeting was adjourned.

The next board meeting will be at 7:30 P.M., Wednesday the 6th of December at the Skagit County Administration Building.
