SURJECT: Skagit County Plenning Countssion Meeting on Flood Storage, Ross Dan, Skagit River, Mashington

L. A meeting of the Water Resource Committee, Singit County Planning Commission, was held on 13 Jenuary 1947. At the request of the countities, the meeting was attended by representatives of Seattle City Light and Paget Sound Power and Light Company; the Chief River Pareceaster, Seattle District, U. S. Weather Bureau; the District Engineer, U.S. Geological Survey; and a representative of the District Engineer.

2. Following a discussion of the flood varning gratem recently inexperated by the U.S. Weather Bureau, the constitute took up the matter of proposed flood storage in Souttle City Light's Ross Reservoir. A semanication from Congression Henry E. Jackson was read by the cheirman, which communication included an apparently verbatin quotation of the third and fourth paragraphs of the letter dated 29 Seventer 1946 from Office, Chief of Engineers to the Federal Power Counterion. Several members of the committee objected to the proposed flood control reservation of 200,000 scre-feet from 1 Hovesber to 1 April on the grounds that, although the amount of storage was adversate, the period suggested did not include the usual curly fall high mater in Setcher, nor the most salt high water of April. In historic times neither of those high unters has enceaded bank-full stage of Singit River, and anticipated reservoir operations are such that flood storage recorration in the months of October and April would reduce the price gover output of the plant. Hevertheless, the representative of Seattle City Light stated that the City would have no objections to reserving 200,000 sure-feet of flood storage from 1 October to 1 May of each year.

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3. No further action was taken by the committee, but it is believed that the committee will recommend to the Finning Commeil that the Federal Power Commission be requested to require flood storage reservation from 1 October to 1 May, and possibly to 1 June.

4. In view of the letter from the Chief of Engineers to Congressman Jackson, which assured him that recommendations of the Corps of Engineers to the Federal Power Commission would provide substantial flood control benefits from the operation of Ross Dam, but which contained none of the figures which were quoted at the meeting, it is believed that the Office, Chief of Engineers may have some interest in this report.

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
