## SUMMARY OF CONVERSATION

ON 13 April 1978, I contacted Jim SNOW, lawyer to the Secretary of Agriculture, to discuss status of the Skagit River Wild & Scenic Rivers classification. He informed me that the decision was made on Tuesday, 11 April, by the Secretary of Agriculture that

① the Skagit Nuclear Power Plant could not be constructed while the River was in "study status" (i.e. until Congress acted on the proposed legislation); ② however, the classification as is currently proposed would not preclude the power plant, based on the Secretary's assessment of the Plant's effects on the River. SNOW will be sending me a copy of the full text of the Secretary's decision, as well as information identifying all rivers in the Seattle

District that are either proposed  
or are classified as Wild & Scenic.
