SCAGIT RIVER PROBLEMS HERE

Committees Meet with the Board of County Commissioners.

A delegation from the River Improvement committee, which was composed of Skagit county citizens and a committee from the Mount Vernon Rotary club, met with the board of county commissioners yesterday afternoon. The delegations requested that the board again include in the budget a 1-mill levy for river protection purposes, but were told that it was too late to include this in the budget for 1924.

H. L. Willis was spokesman for the river committee and asked the board if it would be possible to include the 1-mill levy again this year. He stated that in order to get any outside assistance it was necessary that the county make some start toward creating a fund for river improvement and protection. He also stated that the committee desired the board to hire a competent engineer to make the necessary plans for the improvement of river conditions.

Mr. Van Buren, chairman of the board, said that the board had discussed the Skagit river question when the budget was being prepared but as there was still about \$20,000 in the fund created, the board decided there was no further action to be taken, as they had received no report of the survey work made by an engineer named Stewart. The commissioners advised Stewart when the fund was created by the 1-mill levy.

Mr. Van Buren told the committee that it would be impossible to add to the budget at this time as it already had been advertised and that the hearing on it would be held Monday, October 1.
