SENATOR DILL AND BLACK FOR RIVER CONTROL

Honorable Senator C. C. Dill, member of the senate from this state, was in Mount Vernon last evening and today, accompanied by Lloyd Black, democratic nominee for congress. Both are here making preliminary arrangements for a speaking tour of the county, which will take place next Wednesday.

Last night both Senator Dill and Mr. Black spoke to the large crowd in attendance at the Avon community fair. A few remarks were made with reference to the campaign Mr. Black will make for representative from this district in opposition to Lin Hadley.

Both Senator Dill and Mr. Black dwelt upon flood control here and pledged themselves to the task of securing government aid in this huge undertaking. Senator Dill reiterated his stand in regard to river control when interviewed in this city today. He said that the valley needs protection from floods and that he would do all in his power to bring about relief. In this connection, Mr. Black also promised to produce results.

SPEAK HERE WEDNESDAY

Starting at eleven o'clock Wednesday morning in Clear Lake, Senator Dill and Mr. Black will speak in three other places. At two o'clock addresses will be made in Sedro-Woolley, and at three o'clock in Burlington. The speakers will address a Mount Vernon audience at four o'clock, and will complete their county speech making tour in Anacortes at eight o'clock in the evening.

Senator Dill is a member of the senate oil investigating committee and brings an interesting message. Black spoke here several days ago and notwithstanding a rainstorm, held the attention of his local audience for about an hour.
