June Snow Scene Near Sedro-Woolley



LOCAL MAN PHOTOGRAPHS SNOW FIELD NEAR HERE

These two views show from ten to fifteen feet of snow not ten miles from Sedro-Woolley in Montborne prairie. They were brought here by Norman Fladebo and show him and John Fladebo. The upper view shows snow almost fifteen feet deep, covering thousands of acres, and the other shows Fladebo, at the edge of the prairie snow field, with rifle stretched, to show the depth of the snow. The pictures were taken a few days ago. Fladebo reports the snow deeper than in the big snow year of 1916, as he walked completely over the top of a tree which he had knotted then. That's snow in them thar hills.
