

SEVERAL MORE PROJECTS FOR SKAGIT O. K'D

New Skagit county WPA projects amounting to \$50,488 have been approved, it was announced in Seattle today by George H. Gannon, state WJA administrator. He listed hundreds of state projects which have been approved at Washington, D. C., calling for an expenditure of \$4,587,202, but he warned municipal divisions of the state that approval of a project does not mean it will be constructed. He will select those projects "regarded as most adaptable to speedy prosecution of his state program," the WPA in Washington, D. C. announced.

Gannon said the project approved call for expenditure of perhaps three times as much money as will be available, so that workmen may be shifted from one job to another as projects are completed.

Among the projects approved, three were listed for Mount Ver-

non. They are \$16,257 to reconstruct the Skagit river dike here, \$9,729 to improve the dike here, and \$384 to construct storm sewer and improve Division street.

In the list was also \$7,774 to improve drainage ditches at Burlington, and \$12,000 to construct a school building at Burlington. Superintendent Oliver Hazen said Burlington has no school building plan, but that the money could be used for paving around the high school and building tennis courts, etc.

Improvement of the McMurray school building is listed for \$210, and improvement of the Bay View state park is listed for \$4,132.

Master road programs in both Whatcom and Snohomish counties were approved. Whatcom is listed for \$511,450, and Snohomish is to get \$554,630.
